American Peony Society seeds.



"Peonies...It's Show Time"

They have tips and stories to share about this easy and rewarding hobby of friendly competition.









Introducing the WPS Guest Gardener Program

Introducing an opportunity for WPS members to participate in growing a peony for WPS for 3 years, at which time the said peony will be dug and divided, a division will be kept by the participant (if they would like, otherwise, if not, all divisions can be donated), the other/s will be donated to WPS Root Auction. Participant must agree to terms above. Terms must be strictly adhered to in order for this program to be successful.

First group, 2019, was hand selected by chair (Tracey Nelson) for ease of getting this program going. Future years will be through interest and a lottery type drawing, if interest numbers outweigh what roots are available. Members that participate in this program must be WPS members in good standing through the end of the guest gardener program year (paid up on dues). Goal for this program initially is to preserve Klehm Peony varieties. Ultimately, a goal would be to see the proceeds from the auction of these peony roots to go back in to the program, to purchase more roots, essentially funding itself after disbursement of funds by WPS for the next 3 years as we await the first group's cultivation and propagation efforts. I see this as supporting our auction efforts moving forward, and another way to involve the membership in peony cultivation and preservation.

To further encourage WPS participation, any person interested in the Guest Gardener Program shall submit interest *in person* and a lottery drawing for cultivars will take place, at the Spring Peony Educational Meeting, currently occurring in March. The number of Guest Garden Plants will vary from year to year and will depend on funding, of course.

Guest Gardener Program participants will obtain roots at any given year of participation, at the WPS Root Auction of that year. Participants who are due to dig their guest garden peonies on the given year it is due, shall expect to bring their peony division to the root auction. If unable, must be responsible to get root to chair of guest gardener program by the date of the root auction. Failure to do so will prevent you from any further participation in the guest gardener program. This program can only work if we have responsible participants. I am very excited to get this program underway.

GRAFTING CLASSES

The WPS sponsored a grafting class this past fall, which was held at the West Madison Agricultural Research Station. Jordan Kabat of Solaris Farms was the instructor, and was aided by Kris Casey who also frequently aids with grafting at the farm. The class was well attended with about 17 people present aside from the instructor. Topics covered all aspects of tree peony grafting from good scion collection and storage to planting and after care. Attendees were encouraged to bring along their own scions, and a large amount of the cultivars Age of Gold and Boreas were offered for practice. A nice array of scions were brought in by attendees, including some from harder to find New Zealand cultivars. Jordan also made scions available for purchase of two Bill Seidl seedlings that will remain unregistered and have otherwise never been offered to the public. Most individuals in

attendance were well-equipped with their own knives and cutting mats, which made the hands-on portion of the seminar go very smoothly. Some participants purchased additional parafilm wrap to take home to continue their experimentation, and all were given recommendations regarding other tools and equipment, including what is needed for the process of indoor graft healing. Overall, attendees seemed to find the information to be interesting and helpful, and all were able to make some very nice looking grafts by the end of the seminar. Aspects of the history of this practice and different grafting techniques were shared also, as well as some anecdotes about grafting with Bill Seidl and Nate Bremer, including a demonstration with a less-than-perfect grafting machine that at one time belonged to Bill himself. The seminar has traditionally been held every other year, but Jordan has offered to teach the class every year, with next year's grafting class will be held on August 29th. If this is something you are interested in, stay on top of the WPS newsletters and website for more information as that time approaches.
