### **President's Message**

This fall seems to have flown by for me, especially the last few weeks. I have been busily making new tags and planting Peony roots. In going about my planting, I realized my error in buying way more roots than I have space for. As a good friend of mine often says, "You need another Peony like you need kick in the head." He's right, but it's hard to say no in the dead of winter when looking at all the new catalogs and one special Peony catches your eye, then another, and yet another. Soon you end up with several dozen roots and only space for half that many!

This time of year is particularly exciting as it's time to collect seeds and to watch certain cultivars put on a spectacular show of fall foliage color. One of the standouts this year is a double lactiflora that is not well known or often grown, but has a fantastic plant habit and has beautiful foliage color both in the spring as well as the fall. The cultivar I speak of is 'Shawnee Chief', registered in 1940 by Myron Bigger. This cultivar is one that I recommend everyone grow, that is if you have the room.

WPS had our annual fall auction on Oct. 1; this time it was in-person only. There were over a hundred donations and we raised a total of \$2,507.50! 

#### A Look Into the Future of Peonies

Although our fall root auction was great fun, the business meeting preceding it was even more exciting. Nate Bremer, American Peony Society President and owner of Solaris Farms, presented us with the opportunity to participate financially in a unique and far-reaching study being conducted by the National Academy of Sciences of Belarus and the University of Michigan.

The study focuses on "establishing genomic markers of cultivar identities and related studies that come from understanding the true relationships of different lineages; determining the range and extent of peony diseases, including viruses and how disease resistance relates to the genomic heritage of cultivars, and; how to create an international network of peony collections that conserves the maximal range of peony diversity, since conserving peony diversity is not the same thing as preserving every cultivar possible. All these issues coalesce around contemporary issues in scientific collection databasing and curation\*."

Bremer emphasized the high cost of such studies and the importance of Peony Societies, such as ours, to help support it. He suggested a

\$10,000 donation.

As one might imagine, there was much discussion as to the amount and the timing of our donation. Pat Trapp moved that we donate \$7,500 this year with a promise of more funding in future years. The motion failed. Rita Thomas moved that we donate the full \$10,000 this year. That motion was seconded by Sharon Schmitz and passed.

Cory Tischman is working with Dr. David Michener, BOD of the American Peony Society, as to the best way to make the donation. The university would prefer all donations be made in one lump sum, so they are coordinating that. One big check creates more notice at the university than several smaller checks.

# Hidden Spring Flower Farm By Scott Parker

Hidden Springs Flower Farm was owned and operated over the past 10 years by Brigitte and Harvey Buchite. They decided to retire and sell the nursery along with all the Peony stock. Harvey said they have completed their digging, cleaning, dividing, and packaging Peonies for the last time and that he will miss those activities.

Harvey has spent a lifetime breeding and hybridizing a variety of plants including: Daylilies, Peonies, Sedum, Species Iris, Primroses, and Dianthus. He and Brigitte introduced Wisteria "Blue Moon" which has the unique characteristic of blooming twice a year in zone 4. He has also introduced a series of Peonies called: Romantic Lace, Romantic Dreamer, Romantic Elegance, and Romantic Blush.

He is a past president of both the Minnesota Peony Society and the American Peony Society. In 2022 Harvey was awarded the Bertrand H. Farr Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Peony Society for his work with Peonies. He rejuvenated the Seed Exchange Program for APS, and handed it off to me a number of years ago. Harvey is a world of knowledge of all things Peony and has written numerous articles for the APS Bulletins and other publications including one recently published in Sweden In addition, he has

given numerous presentations about Peonies, from basic information to the most technical, throughout America, Canada, and Europe. In short, Harvey is a walking rolodex of knowledge of all types of plants, but his knowledge of Peonies is equal to none.

Harvey and Brigitte met while attending the University of Minnesota where she was on a Fulbright Scholarship and studying the science of blueberries. Now, after a lifetime of working in the nursery industry, they decided to retire and sell their business. They plan to retire in Brigitte's home country of Austria. We know that he will continue to be involved in the world of Peonies and that he will keep in touch with his Wisconsin Peony friends.
